"Ghost Stories" in the Bible – Part 6 Activities of Jesus' Ghost?

- I. Psalm 16:8-11 Was Jesus actually in the tomb from burial to resurrection?
 - A. Psalm 16:10 does not refer to Jesus' ghost.
 - 1. Verse 10 is a "parallelism," second clause restates the first clause.¹
 - a. "For You will not leave my soul [person] in Sheol" [the grave]
 - b. "Nor will You allow Your Holy One to see corruption"
 - 2. Verse 10 is a detailed explanation of verse 9 in parallelism:
 - "My <u>flesh</u> also will rest in hope.
 - a. "For" (Heb: "consequently"; Greek: "because")
 - 3. Jesus' "soul" (physical person) was the sacrifice for sins:
 - a. Isaiah 53:10-12 describes the death of Jesus' "soul"
 - b. Within three days after death, the body was still called a "soul." After the 3^{rd} day it was called a "carcass" or "corpse" (Lev. 21:11; Num. 6:6-7; Num. 19:11,13; Hag. 2:13).
 - 1. It was the custom to visit the grave for 3 days after burial.²
 - 2. Tombs were abandoned on the 4th day. "It was the common Jewish idea that corruption commenced on the fourth day."³
 - B. Blatant inconsistency of the "Ghost Lounge" theory from these passages:
 - 1. The "Ghost Lounge" is "Abraham's Bosom" (Rich Man & Lazarus)
 - 2. The "Ghost Lounge" is "*Paradise*" (Dying Thief)
 - 3. The "Ghost Lounge" is "<u>Hades</u>" (Jesus' Ghost)
- II. Ephesians 4:7-10: Did Jesus "descend" into a Ghost Lounge when He died?
 - A. Paul quoted Psalm 68:17-18 LXX, God ascending to heaven from Mt. Sinai.
 - B. He drew a comparison to Jesus' ascension.
 - C. Descended to the "lower parts of the land" heaven, to earth, to the grave (Phil. 2:5-8).
- III. 1 Peter 3:18-22: Did Jesus preach to ghosts in the ghost lounge?
 - A. Verses 18-19, He went to proclaim by the "Spirit" <u>after</u> He was resurrected.
 - 1. The TIME of the participles "having been put to death," "having been made alive,"
 - & "having gone," must be <u>antecedent in TIME</u> to the main (indicative) verb, "He proclaimed." Thus Jesus "proclaimed" to these spirits AFTER He was "made alive."
 - B. Verse 22, He proclaimed His new authority to angels and powers, not ghosts.
 - C. Verse 20 Why ONLY to disobedient "spirits" from Noah's day if these are ghosts?
- IV. 1 Peter 4:5-6: Was the Gospel preached to dead people?
 - 1. The Gospel was preached to Abraham (the dead) when he was still alive (Gal. 3:8).
