- II. Sound Rules of Biblical Interpretation (Refresher)
 - **1.** The Original Scriptures are infallible
 - 2. Grammar cannot be violated
 - **3.** Interpret within the historical setting (historical context & culture)
 - **4.** Interpret Scripture progressively (new revelation compliments and builds on older revelation, never contradicting it).
 - **5.** Reject all doctrines that defy sound logic (reject mutually exclusive ideas)
 - **6.** Agreement with God's nature (God never acts contrary to His revealed nature)
 - 7. Literal meaning has priority over non-literal interpretation (objective approach)
 - **8.** Trace the history of doctrines (see how, when, and why doctrines became polluted)
